- 1945 Fort Worth Children's Museum formed in two classrooms in De Zavala Elementary School
- 1947 Museum moved to R.E. Harding House
- 1954 Museum opened in new building on Montgomery Street



# History of the Museum




- 1968 Name changed to Fort Worth Museum of Science and History
- 2009 The new and current building was built

#### The Innovation Studios

- 1992 TCU sought an environment for nontraditional learning
- NSF grant to help bridge gap between the museum and university
- Hands on Science "imaging a different way of doing things," inquiry-based learning

#### On the Innovations Studios Floor




- Interact with guests

- Observations in each studio to dig deeper


# Professional Development with Maker Ed "Making is creating"

- Plant to plate


















# Science on Tap
