- Community Listening Session: South Bay** (January 26, 2018): 102 people attended. Participants: 40% Non-profit Organizations, 36% Government, 13% Concerned Residents, 5% Healthcare Partners, 3% Community Coalitions, 3% Academics/Universities.
- Community Listening Session: South Los Angeles** (January 23, 2018): 73 people attended. Participants: 34% Government, 33% Non-profit Organizations, 15% Concerned Residents, 10% Healthcare Partners, 4% Community Coalitions, 4% Academics/Universities.
- Community Listening Session: San Fernando Valley** (December 14, 2017): 71 people attended. Participants: 50% Government, 29% Non-profit Organizations, 13% Community Coalitions.
